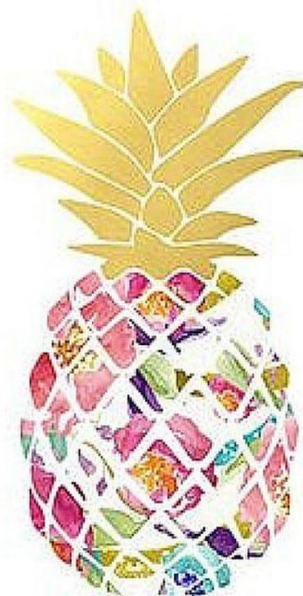

What is Rainbow?

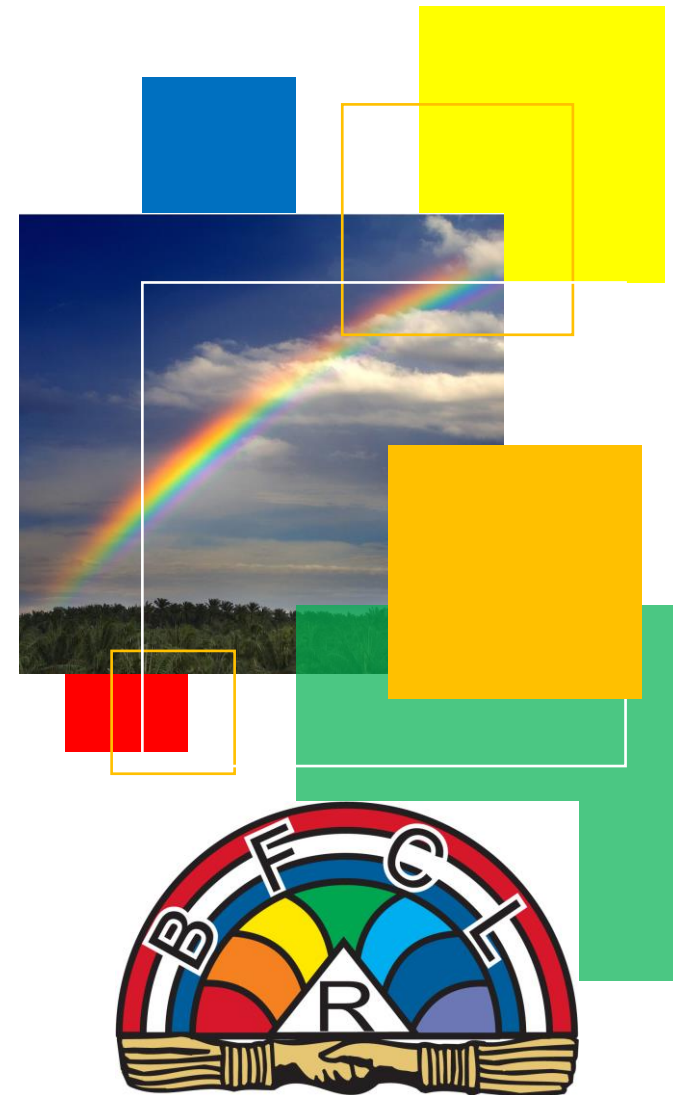

Virginia Rainbow Dress Code

Revised January 2019



Formal Attire

Worn to initiations, Grand Assembly sessions, installations of officers, Grand Visitations and other formal functions.

- Gowns must be floor length in front and back.
- No see-through skirts or slits above the knee.
- There must be a strap on each shoulder.
- Gowns must cover the back up to the regular bra line or have a modesty panel.
- Proper undergarments required.
- No more than 50% black.

Business Attire

Also called “Short Dress”, worn at meetings, other fraternal and civic events.

- Skirts no shorter than 2” above the knee when sitting, or dress pants (no denim) are allowed.
- Dresses/blouses must have a strap on each shoulder.
- No more than 50% black.

Casual

Service projects, practices, public relation events, fundraising, traveling, etc.

- Pants, jeans or shorts are appropriate, but may not have holes and shorts should be fingertip length.
- Shirts must not contain controversial or offensive print.
- Matching Assembly polos or t-shirts encouraged.

Shoes

- Formal or Business Attire: Dress shoes required; must have a back or back strap. No laces.
- Casual: Shoes with backs or back straps. Flip-flops allowed at pools.

Swim

- One- or two-piece providing suit is in good taste and not revealing.
- Cover ups and appropriate casual shoes must be worn traveling to and from pool.

Cultural Attire

- Scottish formal kilt, Filipino barong, Indian saris, etc may be worn as long as it is in accordance with all components of the dress code.

General Appearance

- Proper undergarments must always be worn and not visible.
- No visible tattoos.
- Shawls or cardigans may be worn with dresses; no hoodies please.
- Natural hair color preferred.
- Body piercings (except earrings) should not be worn at Rainbow functions.
- Never travel in pajamas.
- No halter or cropped tops.
- Leggings are allowed under appropriate dresses/skirts but not allowed as pants.
- You must adhere to the host’s rules and dress code when visiting another Rainbow Jurisdiction.

Men’s Attire

- Formal Attire: Suit or tuxedo; jacket optional.
- Business Attire: Dress pants with dress shirt or polo shirt.
